RC23'S SEMICENTENNIAL BIRTHDAY

The International Sociological Association is fifty years of age. This is both very young and quite old. It is surely time to take stock, but we can also say that there is a future that remains to be constructed. Immanuel Wallerstein

The International Sociological Association (ISA) originated in 1948 as an initiative of the Social Science Department (SSD) of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). This initiative resulted in the ISA and similar worldwide associations in other social science disciplines (economics, law, and political science). Jennifer Platt notes in her book "A Brief History of the ISA: 1948-1997"

that this initiative was dictated by the political situation after the Second World War [Platt, 1998, p. 13]. These professional associations were not simply expected to encourage intellectual and

RC 23 SOCIOLOGY OF SCIENCE

ORIGINS

The group which was to become the Research Committee on the Sociology of Science started its work at the Sixth World Congress of Sociology in Evian (1966). No formal papers were presented since plans for the establishment of the Committee were approved only after papers could have been solicited. Nevertheless, there was a very lively and successful discussion among sociologistparticipants. Among them were: R. Aron (France), B. Barber (USA), J. Ben-David (Israel), I. Dubska (Czechoslovakia), S. Dedijer (Sweden), D. Goldschmidt (FRG), R.K. Merton (USA), A. Podgorecki (Poland), J.J. Salomon (France), A. Szalai (Hungary), E. Walter (Switzerland), A. Zvorikine (USSR), and others. A business meeting was held in which Robert K. Merton was elected President and J. Ben-David was elected Secretary. There was a very lovely successful discussion among R. Aron (France), B. Barber (USA), J. Ben-David (Israel), I. Dubska (Czechoslovakia), S. Dedijer (Sweden), D. Goldschmidt (FRG), R. K. Merton (USA), A. Podgorecki (Poland), J. J. Salomon (France), A. Szalai (Hungary), E. Walter (Switzerland), Anatoly Alekseevich Zvorykin (USSR) and others [ISA Bulletin 29, p. 8].

Robert K. Merton was elected President of RC23 and Joseph Ben-David became the first Secretary. There is an interesting document at the Archive of the Russian Academy of Sciences

– a transcript of the meeting's report of the VI International Congress of Sociology in Evian made by Anatoly Alekseevich Zvorykin. A. A. Zvorykin said:

... I think that the foundation of the Research Committee on Sociology of Science was a very important initiative. The Committee filled the essential gap, which was still in the International Sociological Association. Committee was created by the leadership of R. K. Merton... [Transcript, Archive of the RAS].

Nadia Asheulova: Dear colleagues and distinguished guests! It is a great honor for us to open a special Session in Memory of the First RC23 President Robert King Merton. Robert Merton was one of the leading sociologists of the 20th century. The interest in his activity has not dimished. R. Merton's name is connected with many directions in sociological research, but first and foremost it turned into the eponym for sociology of science, the phrase the "Mertonian sociology of science" was widely accepted by the scientific community. In 1966, R. Merton became one of the founders, organizer and the first President of the Research Committee on the Sociology of Science (RC23) of the International Sociological Association. Merton's activity in this position was in many ways decisive for theoretical and institutional development of the sociology of science worldwide. In honor and memory of Robert King Merton, the RC23 Committee has established The Robert K. Merton Award for Distinguished Contribution to the Sociology of Science and Technology.

The Executive Committee of ISA approved the award in May, 2016 and it is intended to recognize and showcase the outstanding, long-term achievement of an individual researcher to the field rather than the excellence of an individual book or single idea. RC23 kindly invites Merton's students, senior researchers and younger scholars with an interest in Robert K. Merton's work to contribute. The session will reconsider Merton's legacy and attempt to link it with contemporary issues. RC23 produced the Silver Medal with a special design.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE 2022 AWARD

Research Committee 23 (Sociology Nominations of Science and Technology) of the International Sociological Association is seeking nominations for The Robert K. Merton Award for Distinguished Contributions to the Sociology of Science and Technology to be awarded at the XX ISA World Congress of Sociology in Melbourne, Australia, July 24-31, 2022.

Eligibility

The award will be granted to a living scholar who is internationally recognized for significant contributions to the Sociology of Science and Technology that have been made over a period of at least two decades. Thus, the award is intended to recognize and showcase the outstanding, long-term achievements of an individual scholar to the field rather than the excellence of Jaime Jiménez Guzmán - Chair specific papers or books.

Currently serving members of the RC23 Board or the Award Committee are not eligible to receive the award.

Nominations can be made by any member of ISA (excluding members of the Award Committee) and must be supported by at least two other members of RC23 and/or ISA in good standing.

Nominations must include the name of the nominee, a CV, the list of publications on which the nomination is based, and a cover letter that provides a rationale for the nomination.

Nominations should be sent by July 31st. 2020 to the Chair of the Awards Committee, Jaime Jiménez Guzmán, at jjimen@unam.mx.


